



WORKPLACE FIRST AID KIT - CLASS B

ANSI/ISEA Z308.1-2021 minimum-fill reference

Class B is intended for more populated, complex, or higher-risk workplaces.

IMPORTANT

OSHA requires adequate first aid supplies to be readily available. Employers should assess workplace hazards, workforce size, kit location, and injury history, then add supplies or additional kits as needed.

MINIMUM CONTENTS

- ☐ **50** Adhesive bandages, 1 x 3 in
- ☐ **2** Adhesive tape rolls, 2.5 yd each
- ☐ **25** Antibiotic applications, 0.5 g
- ☐ **50** Antiseptic applications, 0.5 g
- ☐ **1** CPR breathing barrier
- ☐ **2** Gel-soaked burn dressings, 4 x 4 in
- ☐ **25** Burn treatment applications, 0.9 g
- ☐ **2** Cold packs, at least 4 x 5 in
- ☐ **2** Eye coverings with attachment
- ☐ **4 fl oz** Eye/skin wash, total
- ☐ **1** First aid guide

MINIMUM CONTENTS

- ☐ **1** Foil blanket, approx. 52 x 84 in
- ☐ **20** Hand sanitizer applications, 0.9 g
- ☐ **4 pairs** Medical exam gloves
- ☐ **2** Roller bandages, 2 in x 4 yd
- ☐ **1** Roller bandage, 4 in x 4 yd
- ☐ **1** Scissors
- ☐ **4** Sterile pads, 3 x 3 in
- ☐ **4** Trauma pads, 5 x 9 in
- ☐ **2** Triangular bandages, approx. 40 x 40 x 56 in
- ☐ **1** Splint, approx. 4 x 24 in
- ☐ **1** Tourniquet

KIT MAINTENANCE

Inspect routinely; replace used, damaged, contaminated, or expired items; keep the kit readily accessible; and document restocking. If blood or other potentially infectious materials may be encountered, ensure appropriate PPE is available.

Class B is strongly recommended for construction and other workplaces with high risk of serious injury or amputation.
