



WORKPLACE FIRST AID KIT - CLASS A

ANSI/ISEA Z308.1-2021 minimum-fill reference

Class A is intended for workplaces needing a basic range of supplies for common injuries.

IMPORTANT

OSHA requires adequate first aid supplies to be readily available. Employers should assess workplace hazards, workforce size, kit location, and injury history, then add supplies or additional kits as needed.

MINIMUM CONTENTS

- ☐ **16** Adhesive bandages, 1 x 3 in
- ☐ **1** Adhesive tape roll, 2.5 yd
- ☐ **10** Antibiotic applications, 0.5 g
- ☐ **10** Antiseptic applications, 0.5 g
- ☐ **1** CPR breathing barrier
- ☐ **1** Gel-soaked burn dressing, 4 x 4 in
- ☐ **10** Burn treatment applications, 0.9 g
- ☐ **1** Cold pack, at least 4 x 5 in
- ☐ **2** Eye coverings with attachment
- ☐ **1 fl oz** Eye/skin wash, total

MINIMUM CONTENTS

- ☐ **1** First aid guide
- ☐ **1** Foil blanket, approx. 52 x 84 in
- ☐ **10** Hand sanitizer applications, 0.9 g
- ☐ **2 pairs** Medical exam gloves
- ☐ **1** Roller bandage, 2 in x 4 yd
- ☐ **1** Scissors
- ☐ **2** Sterile pads, 3 x 3 in
- ☐ **2** Trauma pads, 5 x 9 in
- ☐ **1** Triangular bandage, approx. 40 x 40 x 56 in

KIT MAINTENANCE

Inspect routinely; replace used, damaged, contaminated, or expired items; keep the kit readily accessible; and document restocking. If blood or other potentially infectious materials may be encountered, ensure appropriate PPE is available.

If the workplace has higher risk for severe injury, evaluate whether a Class B kit is more appropriate.
